

7. The Mature Christian Seeks Righteousness by Faith – Part 2

Paul concludes his argument that the gospel he has preached and modeled is superior in its ability to save and reward those who believe and remain faithful to the end. (Philippians 3:7-21)
Paul continues his argument concerning the proper system for salvation – one that is received by faith, not works of the Law.
